Doc E → The one appearing in the Dec. 1957 issue of US News & World Report, the ~~the~~ Eisenhower administration promoted intervention in ~~the~~ Asia to stem the influence of Communism. Although Eisenhower was remarkably pacifist for a former general, US involvement in Korea & Vietnam were tangible manifestations of American fear. Most notably, Eisenhower heightened US involvement in Vietnam in 1953 after the French defeat at Dien Bien Phu. While it would have been relatively easy for Eisenhower to ignore the conflict in Vietnam (just as he did the Hungarian Revolution in 1956), this step ~~marked~~ indicates Eisenhower's <sup>how</sup> good intentions were, at times, harmful to long-term American interests. Eisenhower's efforts to deal with the Red Scare, the Space Race, & the containment of Communism overseas are characteristic of much of his Presidency. While he was a popular figure & war hero, he ~~often~~ was often unsuccessful in substantially <sup>improving</sup> ~~changing~~ the dynamic of Cold War America.
